Travel Nevada's Special Projects Grant Program for Fiscal Year 2026 is part of a **new phase of destination development** focused on **smaller-scale**, **high-impact** projects that address **immediate needs**, **build community strength**, **and improve visitor readiness**.



Over 61 million adults (26% of the population) live with a disability in the U.S.

- 1. One-Year Programmatic Support & Training: Up to \$100,000 set aside for projects such as education, technology solutions, and visitor-readiness programs for improving accessible/inclusive visitor experiences.
- 2. Two-Year Infrastructure Projects: Up to \$400,000 for improvements to facilities, attractions, and recreation amenities that provide more accessible and inclusive visitor experiences for the enhancement and/or expansion of tourism infrastructure to be more accessible/inclusive.
