Along with the Nevada Governor's Office and the Nevada Department of Health and Human Services, the Nevada Division of Tourism is closely monitoring the spread of COVID-19. We are taking precautions according to information and recommendations released by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, the World Health Organization and state and local health departments. While there are no specific travel restrictions in the U.S. at this time, citizens and travelers should monitor travel guidance on [CDC.gov](https://www.cdc.gov).

How is COVID-19 impacting the Nevada tourism industry?

Travel is an important economic driver throughout the U.S., including in Nevada. While it is too early to know the long-term impact on the tourism economy in Nevada, the priority now is public safety. We are taking precautions according to information and recommendations released by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, the World Health Organization and state and local health departments.

Is the Nevada Division of Tourism still promoting travel?

We are encouraging travelers to review the latest recommendations from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention to inform travel decisions. Out of respect for travelers in countries that have travel restrictions or warnings, the Nevada Division of Tourism has stopped promotions in some international markets. At this time, federal public health officials have issued no restrictions on travel in the U.S., including Nevada. As the situation evolves, federal or state policies may change, or in the event of an overriding health measure, the Nevada Division of Tourism marketing efforts may change.

Should my destination/attraction still promote visitation?

That decision should be made by your team. The Nevada Division of Tourism, along with 150 other travel-related organizations in the U.S., urges travelers to make fact-based decisions about traveling (see a complete statement [here](#)), and to review the latest recommendations from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention to inform those decisions. If the Nevada Division of Tourism's marketing efforts change, we will share updates with our partners.

How can I help visitors and potential visitors feel safe?

The Nevada Division of Tourism encourages you to institute preventative measures as directed by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. If you are an attraction or other tourism property, we suggest increasing health and safety supplies such as additional sanitizing stations.
